Introduction

Established in 2001 as a registered charity organisation in Hong Kong, Pathways was founded by a team of experienced and qualified reading specialists and allied professionals dedicated to serving children with dyslexia. Its aim is to help these children overcome their learning difficulties and build their confidence and motivation in learning.

Currently there are three Pathways learning/support centres, with more than 40 teachers offering over 300 children with dyslexia timely after school and in school intervention in Chinese, English, Mathematics and Pre-school education, plus professional support from clinical psychologists, occupational therapists and speech therapists. Pathways also provides teacher training and holds parent workshops and seminars to share expert knowledge and experience.

Pathways has always received keen support from professionals in the field. In recent years, Professor Pui-Wan Cheng, Adjunct Associate Professor of the Department of Educational Psychology at the Chinese University of Hong Kong, was invited to lead the teaching team to reinforce teacher training and curriculum development. In addition, under the guidance of Dr. Catherine Lam, expert in developmental and behavioural paediatrics, our teachers and parents are more knowledgeable and informed on the topic of early identification for children at risk of dyslexia, and have a better understanding of assessing the effectiveness of intervention, so that they can help students to overcome their learning difficulties and realize their full potential in life.

Immersing in a Meaningful Career with a Mission

I really like Pathways' vision – Bridging the Gap. After I graduated from university, I joined Pathways. I have worked with them for eight years. Yet my passion has not lessened with the passage of time. Every day I enjoy working with different groups of

children to bridge their learning gap.

At Pathways, we help children learn Chinese characters by analyzing its source and sound. But due to the long history of Chinese characters, word rules are not well-defined, making word decoding more difficult. Under these circumstances, I teach students to use strategies which can help them remember and recognize a new word, such as create a story by drawing it so that it is more memorable.

Every child is unique and each has different barriers to cross using various ways which suit them. It takes time to learn and together we can build the bridge to help them cross the learning barrier.



Knowledge Skills Transfer – from the Corporate World to Developing a Career in Specific Learning Difficulties

Although most of Pathways' teacher have backgrounds in education and teaching, quite a number of us like myself underwent a career change, and found meaning and

For example, the mathematics teacher showed me how to remember "The Chinese Multiplication Table (九因歌)" by drawing a picture. Besides being able to apply what I have learned, I can also share these little secret tips with my schoolmates! For English, the teacher taught us phonics. When I came across words which I did not know or had not seen before, I also used phonics to help me learn. To learn Chinese, my teacher

encouraged me to create my own stories. I once wrote two stories – "New version of Three Little Pigs" and "The Beautiful Mermaid and Cinderella" – as a gift to my Chinese teacher at Pathways!

Besides the care and attention shown by Pathways' teachers towards their students, what is most memorable is the friendship among students in the class group. I really enjoyed my learning experience here!
